We prepare students to become teachers at the elementary (1-6), secondary (7-12), and special education (K-12) levels. The department offers 3 Master's degree programs in elementary, secondary, and special education.

The Department of Curriculum and Instruction offers teacher support to our graduates in the form of virtual professional development. This support is a Community of Practice (COP) in which new teachers share their concerns, interests and passions. The COP allows the HUSOE to generate better program/completer impact on student learning outcomes, provides program completers with systematic professional and career-related support, and provides a platform for employers to recruit program completers.
