PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The Educational Administration Guided Leadership Experiences (E.A.G.L.E.) doctoral program (Ed.D) is specifically designed for practicing K-12 administrators who aspire to be superintendent of schools or in senior level positions.

The 66-credit hour program reflects the School of Education's commitment to urban and diverse school systems through course content, faculty composition and clinical experiences. The core curriculum is designed to meet Educational Leadership Constituent Council district level standards.

A unique aspect of this program is its interdisciplinary content. Candidates may select elective course offerings from other academic programs within Howard University such as Business, Communication, Social Work, Law, Political Science and Public Administration.
