### ELEMENTARY EDUCATION MAJOR

Within the Department of Curriculum & Instruction (C&I), faculty prepare candidates to become teachers in Elementary (1-6), Secondary (7-12), and Special Education (K-12). The B.S. in Elementary Education and the minor in Secondary Education are designed to prepare teachers that can facilitate optimal teaching and learning for all students, particularly in urban communities. Candidates in the program must pass the applicable Praxis exams administered by ETS, before completing the program.

### PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

- Students will have a STEM intensive curriculum, which prepares them for a competitive career in education.
- The undergraduate program includes a domestic and global student teaching experience.
