Goals

- To maintain a comfortable environment that will motivate learning.
- To provide multicultural education and foster respect and appreciation for diversity.
- To encourage individual creativity.
- To improve and expand the child's natural ability to think, problem solve and speak clearly.
- To foster and protect the child's physical health and safety.
- To assist in the development of each child's emotional and social skills by encouraging self-confidence, selfexpression, self-discipline, and curiosity.
- To provide parents with an understanding of developmentally appropriate practices.
- To solicit and provide support to the Howard University Community through in-service training, research in child development, student practicums, etc.



Enrollment Policy

The program enrolls children 2.9 to 6.0 years of age.

Classes

The core program is between 9:00 a.m. -12:00 p.m. Breakfast is served at 8:30 a.m. Various enrichment activities are scheduled for the afternoon beginning at 3:30 p.m. At no additional charge, children can arrive as early as 7:30 a.m. and be picked up no later than 5:45 p.m. However, no child should be left at school for more than 9.5 hours (HUELP Policy).

HUELP offers 3 tuition options: 1) HU Employee, 2) HU Full-Time Student, and 3) Community/Non-Howard Employee. Tuition information is available upon request.

Tuition is due on the tenth day of each month, beginning in <u>August</u> of the year of enrollment.

An application form and a non-refundable registration fee are required for placement on the waiting list. It is the parent's responsibility to keep the office informed of any change in the information on the form while the child is on the waiting list.

Calendar

The academic year begins in late August and ends in mid-June. However, the Early Learning Program observes all holidays and school closings identified on the Howard University Calendar.
