PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Our training prepares students to explore individual, family, and societal factors that impede and promote mental wellness. Our faculty work with students to support students' professional development.

Students within the program explore an array of research topics that address diverse populations. They complete clinical trainings within diverse settings that address the mental health needs of urban populations.

Qualified applicants will be invited for an interview in February. We attempt to make offers in mid to late February.

Strong applicants to our program have prior research experience and an interest in conducting research. They will also have a strong psychology background.
