## PROGRAM: OVERVIEW

EAGLE III is a co-designed, co-delivered partnership between the HUSOE and local school districts which aims to build a deep bench of leaders who are prepared to assume district and senior-level leadership roles; increase the number of leaders of color in the school district who hold terminal degrees; and develop scholar-practitioners who possess the contextual knowledge and skills to address the unique opportunities and challenges of the school district in which they are currently employed.

### THE EAGLE III PROGRAM:

- Allows students to be members of a cohort with colleagues from their district.
- The opportunity to learn from both HU faculty and district leaders/practitioners through co-taught classes.
- The convenience of class meetings held at a central location in the District.
- Participation in the nationally recognized AASA/Howard University Urban Superintendents Academy.
- Availability of current research conducted in the school district by doctoral students for their dissertation work.
- Opportunity for school district to co-design the experiential cognate coursework based on the district's needs and priorities.



## Admission Requirements:

- Master's Degree, at least a 3.0 overall graduate GPA
- Administrator 1 certification
- Official university transcripts from previous institutions
- Current full-time employment as a teacher leader or school leader
- Three strong letters of recommendation including one from a supervisor
- 2 page autobiographical sketch & 2 page statement of interest
