PROGRAM OVERVIEW

HELPS is a 72-credit hour program that is designed to prepare the next generation of educational leaders to serve in administrative and management positions such as college presidents, provost and vice presidents, particularly at Minority Serving Institutions (MSIs). Currently, when policy conversations occur in educational contexts, few individuals have a thorough background on MSIs, limiting their ability to discuss how policy impacts these institutions. The HELPS program prepares students to become policy advocates for MSIs.

Coursework is enriched with course-related activities like guest lectures and workshops from MSI presidents and leaders to provide students with salient insight into effective higher education leadership.
